

Proposed DRS default transfer process

We are proposing that in undefended DRS cases, the complainant should have the right to a transfer of the domain name registration on payment of a fee of £200 (plus VAT).
Please read our consultation paper for full details of this proposed default transfer process and then answer the questions below.

2. Please give your reasons for why you feel this way about the proposal

The DRS system is already weighted far too heavily in favour of the complainant, especially the larger 'corporate' bullies. The new proposal would give the impression that Nominet is working for them rather than for its members, its tag holders and its existing registrants.

This proposal will greatly increase the number of spurious claims against existing registrants. If the figure of £200 is to be applied anywhere, it should become the figure required to instigate a DRS in the first place rather than the proposed £10. Once again the proposed sum (£10) would only reinforce the impression that Nominet is working against its members and not for them.

I would respectfully remind Nominet that it is WE, the long-term registrants and registrars who have allowed the organisation to grow to its current status, not those who make spurious domain name claims simply because 'we got there first'!
