We are proposing that in undefended DRS cases, the complainant should have the right to a transfer of the domain name registration on payment of a fee of £200 (plus VAT).

1. A "default judgement", with appropriate safeguards as proposed, will bring the DRS into line with other enforcement systems such as the courts. Such systems have worked well in practice for many years;
2. Costs for enforcing Rights under the Policy against serial domain squatters will be lowered, consequently increasing the ease of enforcement;
