

## Proposed DRS default transfer process

We are proposing that in undefended DRS cases, the complainant should have the right to a transfer of the domain name registration on payment of a fee of £200 (plus VAT).  
Please read our consultation paper for full details of this proposed default transfer process and then answer the questions below.

This is not a good idea. The default should be that the domain STAYS with whoever registered it. Only if a decision is made in the DRS process to move it away from the original registrant, should the domain be transferred. If it were to change then as the cost is so low to initiate a DRS action, many abusive claims could be made, especially where it could be inferred from the whois information that the domain might be subject to a default transfer. This would effectively end up suiting those on the prowl for interesting domain names, but not those who have registered names, often through a registrar who does not vet the contact information too carefully.
