

Proposed DRS default transfer process

We are proposing that in undefended DRS cases, the complainant should have the right to a transfer of the domain name registration on payment of a fee of £200 (plus VAT).

2. Please give your reasons for why you feel this way about the proposal

- The scale of the problem is less than half of what was originally stated by Nominet as the reason for the proposal – an error they have now admitted. Their public response was to quietly amend the consultation page with some carefully spin doctored verbiage and carry on as though nothing had happened.
- The County Court system provides a cheap (£150 issue fee) option (with proper safeguards) that can deal with cases where default is likely. Why reinvent the wheel?
 - The best thing Nominet can do to resolve much of this is to clean up the details on their database.
- The proposed system puts too much discretionary power into the hands of Nominet – in other words employees of the privately owned monopoly registry being given the arbitrary power to decide whether a case has been made or not.
 - The whole thing is open to abuse – both unscrupulous corporates and domainers will fire off spurious DRS claims in the hope of getting lucky.
