

Proposed DRS default transfer process

We are proposing that in undefended DRS cases, the complainant should have the right to a transfer of the domain name registration on payment of a fee of £200 (plus VAT).

1. The majority of registrants of the 6 Million .uk domain names have not been consulted on this, or even the wider issues raised in the DRS Consultation as a whole. This is something that could have been easily done by sending an email to every Registrant detailing the DRS Consultation being held and notifying them that it would be affecting their contract of registration with Nominet.

2. This proposal is clearly biased towards the complainant and it is clearly unfair to the registrant, in particular those who hold large portfolios of domains (i.e. domainers - those who invest in domain names). As a result it is a proposal that is very obviously open to abuse by unscrupulous Complainants who may want to chance thier luck!
